The post holder will be required to use a citizen led, strengths focused approach to carry out collaborative assessments with people to determine their outcomes, analysing their functional abilities, their environments and significant occupations prior to making recommendations and carrying out interventions.

A good working knowledge of the social model of disability is vital. Awareness of equipment provision and both minor and major adaptations is also beneficial. Knowledge and experience of applying several different approaches and techniques will help the applicant increase the independence and wellbeing of those with complex physical conditions and other associated conditions.

A good understanding and experience of manual handling and supporting legislation would be invaluable in this post. Excellent communication skills are required to work with multi-disciplinary team members, citizens and their families as well as other agencies that support our practice. Excellent recording and computer skills are also required.

A good structure of supervision and support is available for the successful applicant, in line with the Royal College of Occupational Therapists Career Framework guidance.
