As a Social Worker you will need to have a sound understanding of the Social Services and Wellbeing Act (Wales) 2014, Mental Capacity Act 2005, Multi-disciplinary working; NHS Continuing Health Care (CHC) and the ability to manage a complex case load. Effective communication skills including verbal and written, are key to this role as is having the ability to create and maintain good working relationships with all parties.

Our team embraces flexible agile working, allowing employees to work from home while encouraging one day of office attendance per week.

The ability to speak Welsh is desirable.
