## 1.0 Job Purpose

To work as the Play-scheme Supervisor, motivating teams of Play-workers to deliver open access play opportunities for children in Flintshire aged 5 years - 12 years.

### 2.0 Principle Accountabilities

- 2.1 To supervise Play-workers in order for Flintshire County Council to be able to provide quality open access play opportunities for children in Flintshire. To support and motivate Play-workers.
- 2.2 To work as part of a team of Supervisors sharing workloads and responsibilities to ensure that a well organised scheme is delivered.
- 2.3 To treat each Play-worker and child on site with equal warmth and respect.
- 2.4 To work in accordance with health and safety guidelines as instructed during training
- 2.5 To liaise with the Play-workers on site on a daily basis
- 2.6 To check all reporting procedures are maintained.
- 2.7 To check all administration procedures are operated as instructed on site
- 2.8 To deliver a programme of school visits & presentations in Flintshire in advance to promote the County Summer Playscheme Programme
- 2.9 To maintain attendance figures at each site
- 2.10 To produce reports as requested at the end of scheme
- 2.11 To maintain stock levels and records of stock at both the start and the end of the scheme
- 2.12 To record details for the local authorities Payroll section. To record and investigate absences from work and late timekeeping
- 2.13 To prepare and deliver training for Play-workers
- 2.14 To undertake any other duties as required to ensure the successful delivery of the open access play programme in Flintshire

#### 3.0 Job Context

The post of Supervisor has been established to allow the delivery of open access play services in local communities. The County Summer playscheme programme is delivered across the County at 55+ sites working with local Town and Community Councils in partnership with the Local Authority & Welsh Assembly Government. There are approximately 100 + staff recruited in order to deliver a three - six week scheme. The Supervisors role is pivotal in terms of the communication between colleagues and the public
